## The Plenary...

Our **first plenary** speaker, Frank Ciampa, is a retired ACPE supervisor who spent the past twenty-eight years as a supervisor at Clarion Health Partners, Indianapolis, IN. He is a United Methodist ordained elder who received his B.A. degree from Otterbein College, his M.Div. from United Theological Seminary and his Th.M. in Pastoral Care and Counseling from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. Frank held several offices in the East Central Region of ACPE, including the position of regional director, which he held until his retirement in 2004.

Frank will address us Thursday, April 7, on our story to date: "Who We Were." Frank will tell the stories of the historical movement of pastoral care and education.

George Gibbs will recount and summarize some of the factors and forces at work that led to the formation and development of CPSP and its unique place in the larger story.

Our **second plenary** speaker, addressing the theme, "Who We Are," will focus on the diversity, covenantal relationships and organizational structure of CPSP. John Harris will facilitate a panel discussion that will critique what is evolving in CPSP as a result of our own uniqueness. Panel members include Roger Mace, Sr. Mary Davis and Richard Liew.

Our **third plenary** speaker will be Joan Hemenway. Joan is currently the part-time director of the Pastoral Education Consortium, Yale-New Haven Health System. She is the President-Elect of ACPE, a long time APC Board Certified Chaplain, and a Fellow of AAPC. She is the author of the widely read *Inside the Circle: A Historical and Practical Inquiry concerning Process Groups in CPE*. She has served many leadership roles in ACPE and in 2000 was the recipient of the Distinguished Service Award. A United Methodist minister, she is a graduate of Andover-Newton Theological School and Union Theological Seminary.

Joan will speak on Friday, April 8, about our movement into the future: "Who We Shall Be." Her respondent will be Raymond Lawrence, Director of Pastoral Care, New York Presbyterian Hospital-Columbia Presbyterian Center, and General Secretary, CPSP.
